

**Algona City Council  
Council Meeting  
January 8, 2013**



Mayor David Hill called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM in the Council Chambers of Algona City Hall. He initiated the flag salute. Roll call was taken with Council members Tim Fairley, Bill Thomas, Ed Britz, Lynda Osborn, and Paul Mallary was present. Staff members present were Diana Quinn – City Administrator, Buster McGehee – Police Chief, Kari Sand – City Attorney, James Schrimpsner – Police Detective and Laurie Ulrich – Deputy City Clerk.

**PRESENTATIONS**

- Aukeen District Court – Chief Presiding Judge, Corrina Harn, King County District Court, talked about the options that they could offer Algona for court services. She gave a history of how they run their courts. It was established in 2007 between King County and the cities. They determined the contract to be a minimum of 5 years with an 18 month cancellation for both parties. She said the cities are only billed for what services they actually use on a monthly basis. They are on a completely electronic records system. This allows for a timelier process. They hold quarterly meetings that allow the cities to attend for any concerns that they may have. They also have monthly meetings at the facility to continue to go over how things are running and the particular needs of the cities. They have a video link with SCORE installed in their courthouse that is no cost to Algona. They currently have 13 cities that contract with them in the south end of King County. They will be putting together a comparison of our court services in Pacific and what it would have cost the City of Algona using their services to the best of their ability.
