REPORTS -

Councilmember Fairley: He was called by the VRFA to attend the Fire Ops in Pasco. He went up 105ft in full gear with 65 lbs of equipment on his back. He crawled around a live building and put a fire out. He said it was well worth the trip.

Councilmember Thomas: He mentioned that May 16th – May 20th is National Public Works week.

Councilmember Britz: None

Councilmember Osborn: The Hometown Community Services had a Mother's Day lunch and they served 21 people. The Hometown Community Services will be disbursing items from World Vision on Thursdays to the community. She attended the City School Forum and they talked about replacing Auburn High school.

Councilmember Mallary: The International Farmers Market is on its way and they would like to place a banner in the City of Algona. He will check for locations and get approval on where to place it. He mentioned the Cities and School Reach out Fair will be held at the Auburn Performing Arts Center on October 6th. He will be attending the Metro Solid Waste Committee meeting on May 13th. They are accurately setting up costs for appraisals. He is also attending the Growth Management Board meeting this Thursday.

Mayor David Hill: He went to Washington D.C. and met with Senator Patty Murray, Senator Maria Cantwell, Representative Dave Reichert and Representative Adam Smith. They discussed receiving money for repairing West Valley Highway. He said the stimulus money all went to the big cities. The City of Algona was not part of the Puget Sound Regional Councils list to receive funding for capital projects. He encouraged the Council members to attend the Cities and school forum in October and has volunteered to host the next meeting. They talked about the new Auburn High school and their early childhood education program. It's a program geared towards helping early childhood learning before kindergarten and costs about \$300 per student. Boeing has agreed to put up laptops for the program. The school district is looking into having the community raise about \$25,000 from businesses for the program. They would like to see daycare providers implement these services. He is negotiating with the City of Auburn to provide our planning services. This would save the City of Algona money. He would like to bring the proposed agreement forward on the June 14th meeting. The Public Works Department has been out marking trees to take down that are on our City right-of-way. It will be bid out. They have also been busy mowing the City ditches.




