Algona, are requesting that the speed limit be reduced to 10 miles per hour, with signs posted on both westbound and eastbound sides of the street, and a permanent "Slow, Children at Play" sign be posted at the entrance to the street.

Second Avenue North is a dead end street. There are approximately twelve children living on the street between the ages of 4 years old and 15 years old, eight of whom play together regularly in front of the houses. There are a number of people who exceed the 25 mile per hour speed limit, making the area unsafe for children, even pedestrians. The signatures below represent the residents of Second Avenue North who are concerned about making our street a safer place to play with this traffic revision.

Mayor Hill said he would look into this and will get back with her.
