Councilmember Fairley: None

Councilmember Thomas: He said he's been seeing a lot of work completed in Algona. He asked if the crosswalk on 1st Avenue has been completed yet. He also looked in to the transportation group for the roads but was unable to find one.

Councilmember Britz: He asked if there were any grants for the crosswalk on Boundary. Mayor Hill said that the City of Auburn will not agree to put in a crosswalk on their side of Boundary.

Councilmember Osborn: She said Hometown Community Services met with Jeanette with Future Wise last week and they are working on applying for some grants for the City of Algona. She said she helped gather information for the Rose Foundation grant that went in today.

Councilmember Dofelmire: She attended the Domestic Violence Task Force meeting and they were going over the initial reports that the police officer get when there's been a domestic violence incident. The task force is trying to get more questions and ideas of the developments that occur and they are working on the confiscation of the guns with the jurisdictions.

Diana Quinn: She has been working on the community center/city hall project looking at Council Minutes

getting a final drawing for the exterior and interior of the building. She has been working with King County and the Mayor on the transfer station.

Mike Sanford: Officer Bard has been attending the academy and Officer D'Angelo has completed his field training. He will be working on the domestic violence warrant round up next month. He will be providing detail on the traffic issues within the City of Algona and the locations that are being watched for violations.

Mayor Hill: Last Wednesday he had the Sound Cities board of directors meeting held here at city hall. He gave them a tour of the existing transfer station site and future transfer station site. He also had them tour the Tim's Cascade facility located in the industrial area of Algona. The sound wall is moving along. King County Solid Waste has until October 5th to strike a deal with the City of Algona regarding the transfer station. He said there is an environmental study that the City wants included in the final contract. He will be bringing recommendations forward for approval from the Council next month. The Boeing plume is going well and the timeline for cleanup will start in 2017 and should take about a year.


ADJOURNMENT -
