Police Chief Schrimpsheer –Our newest recruit Roxanne Fajardo will be starting on July 26, 2022 and starting the academy on August 16, 2022. She will be graduating on December 12, 2022. Emily Greve will be graduating on November 9, 2022. We are the only police department in the state of Washington to have 50 percent men and 50 percent women. We had a couple of incidents. The street racing task force took down a major organizer of these illegal street races. We were asked to assist with the arrest and utilize our drone. The second incident, we were called to assist Renton on Saturday night for a large gathering resulting in a shooting. We were asked to provide technical assistance with both our drone and our mobile fingerprint system. On Thursday, I attended a press conference with our governor at the Criminal Justice Center regarding the four new regional academies. During the heat wave, we will have the cooling station located in the Community Center open from 8 a.m. until 7 p.m. After hours will be manned by our Public Works staff. We have an intense public disclosure request going on. We have six events planned for National Night Out. I want to give kudos to Gary for always helping.
