Line of sight issues and increased traffic are enough for the City to warrant the four-way stop. There's also parking problems on 8th Ave N pushing cars to park on Algona Blvd. A lot of thought went into this decision. The positive comments left out of the previous conversations. We have made a lot of progress in the last few years with projects and grant funding. Thanks to comments made by the public in Council meetings, Public works was able to prioritize cleaning out the ditch to help with flooding. The four-way stop conversation has be transparent and robust. Please stop by the office if there are more questions.

Karen Koubele, 35 4th Ave S - Being told the ditch was cleaned, live right next to the ditch and it hasn't been cleaned out. Hasn't in years. Basement will flood if it isn't cleaned out. Also the stop sign says temporary, but it's being talked about like it's permanent. Should put one on 4th Ave and Algona Blvd as well.
