Mayors Message

Update on our actions to mitigate the flooding in our city:

Starting at the end of June 2023, we cleared the brush and debris along the fence boarding the east side of the 167 ditch. The cleanup was from 2^{nd} AVE N to the northern city limits at Boundary Blvd. Starting June 2024, we will continue to clear the fence line from 2^{nd} AVE N to the southernmost city limit at 5^{th} AVE S.

During the same time period, we cleaned the 167 ditch of debris from 6^{th} AVE N to Boundary BLVD. The plan for this year is to continue the ditch cleaning process moving south to 5^{th} AVE S.

The Public Works Department is currently working on cleaning out all of the storm drains throughout the city. This will help to make sure that the storm system is clear and flowing.

Our biggest issue continues to be in the northwest end of the city. We have purchased the land west of Algona BLVD and north of 11th AVE N so that we can implement a system to help mitigate the flooding whether it's a retention or detention pond, a pump station, etc. Public Works Director Russ Avery has put out a request for proposals to find an engineer to begin the project. Chief Schrimpsher, who is our Emergency Manager, has been working hard together with our local Legislative Representative Kristine Reeves, Representative Jamila Taylor, and Senator Claire Wilson to obtain the funding for the flood mitigation project through the state capital budget. This funding will go towards design and engineering of the project and during the 2025 legislative session we will go after the funding to start construction.

I ask for your continued patience as we work with other agencies to put in an effective solution. It has been a long time coming for flooding efforts to be made and I am reassured with the steps taken by staff.
