Pet License

Don't forget to get your pet licensed. You can go to their website at www.metroanimalservices.org and click on the License My Pet tab, or you can drop into our City Hall, or go into the Shelter to purchase licenses.

Altered dogs are \$20/year. Altered cats are \$12/year. Unaltered dogs and cats are \$60/year. Senior Citizens 65 years and over pay ½ those licensing fees.

Even your furry family members are “inside” pets, they are still required to be licensed.



Mayors Message

It's Spring Time. A great time of the year to start your summer projects. Flower beds are being filled with flowers, vegetables plants are breaking through the soil and the leaves are coming out of the trees. I am also bringing this up at this time because home owners are starting projects around their homes that require a permit.

When is a Building Permit necessary?

A property owner or developer will need a building permit at any time that a proposed project includes erection, construction, reconstruction, alteration, repair, conversion, maintenance of any building or structure.

The following project examples would require a permit:

Any structural change to your home—Construct a building over 120 square Ft.

Construct a rebuild a deck or porch—Add a roof to a deck or porch —Re-roof a building

Build a retaining wall—Have fill dirt delivered—Install a Sprinkler System

When you are planning a project please take the time and go to our website and see if your project will need to have a building permit before you start. You can also call Dean Wenner our Code Enforcement /Permit Tech.

West Valley HWY Road Closures Starting 5/13/2024 through 9/15/2024 to straighten the curve out of the West Valley HWY, install underground power and remove the overhead power, install multiple culverts, waterlines and to create the entrance to the new transfer station.

Starting May 13th the southbound lanes of the West Valley HWY north of the entrance to the old transfer station and the north construction entrance to the new transfer station will be shut down through 7/15/2024.

The north bound lanes will be shut down from 7/15/2024 through 9/15/2024 north of the entrance to the old transfer station and the north construction entrance to the new transfer station will be shut down.

A full closure of the West Valley HWY will occur the weekend of 7/26 through 7/29 for the culvert install.
